Teaching and Learning

- Our attendance goal for the year is to exceed a 97% attendance rate. Our attendance rate for the past three weeks are as follows:
 - o 2/27 3/03: 95.2%
 - 0 2/13 217: 95.48%
 - o 2/06 2/10: 95.77%
- 8th grade students have been selected to take the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) this year. NAEP is administered by the U.S. Dept. of Education & is intended to serve as a common measure of student achievement across the country. The results of NAEP are released as The Nation's Report Card, which provides info about student achievement to educators, parents, policymakers & the public. 8th graders will be assessed in either reading or math.
- We are proud to recognize all of our awardees for receiving Honorable Mention, Honor Roll, and the prestigious Headmaster's award in Term 2. 663 students fell into this category, comprising approximately 47% of our student body! Congratulations and let us work to grow this number for Term 3.
- On March 7th, Christine Cronin from the BPS Office of Academics and Professional Learning will visit the ILT to engage the O'Bryant community in an academic discussion about cognitively demanding tasks. All are welcome to attend.
